Notable

- Changes to the course since last year include rebuilding greens and bunkers. Also moved a large oak tree on No. 5; converted the No. 5 fairway bunker with the island in the center to a waste area; added palm trees, an oak tree and two pine trees to No. 10 and No. 16 landing areas.
- Weather has been colder than normal with times of drought.
- Changes to the course prior to last year included converting No. 2 and No. 6 fairway bunkers back to waste areas.
- A pro tee was added on No. 7 before the 2023 tournament.
- Ahead of the 2022 event new tees were added on No. 2, 5 and 17 and a palm tree was added to No. 10 greenside bunker.
